

# Cornfield School COVID-19 Control Measures

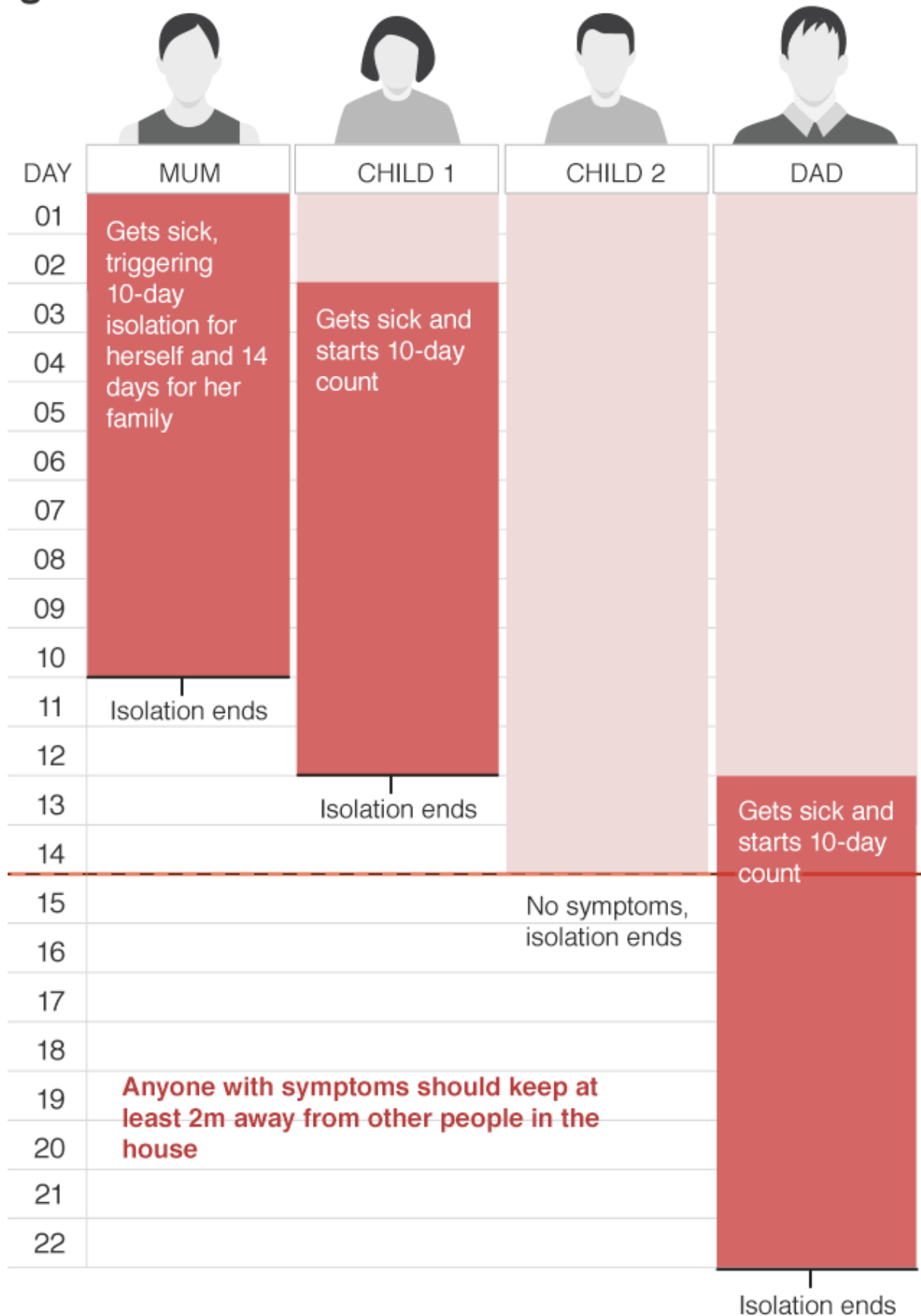
## Parents

### Changes to the school Day and operations in school

<b>Entry to school</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 staggered start and finish times for Pupils reducing contact between year groups</li> <li>• On arrival at school all pupils are met by a member of the Senior Team greeted and asked to sanitise hands</li> </ul>
<b>Social distancing and preventative measures</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We have established a keep right in the corridors system to reduce contact in the circulation areas of the school and to encourage 1-2m distancing</li> <li>• Markings on the floor to encouraging social distancing in key areas</li> <li>• Pupils are being asked to sanitise/ wash hands regularly; as they leave/enter a classroom, come in from outside and before and after lunch.</li> <li>• All pupils have been issued 3 Cornfield school face coverings but pupils may wear their own mask as long as appropriate for school- no bandanas scarves or face coverings with slogans are to be worn</li> <li>• All pupils in Upper school are asked to wear face coverings in corridors and communal areas of the school</li> <li>• Face coverings must be worn and handled as per the World Health Organisations advice leaflet which has been issued to each pupil and displayed around the school</li> <li>• Face coverings are to be worn for 1 day and then laundered. A clean face covering is to be worn each day.</li> </ul>
<b>Breaks/Lunch</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Separate breaks for upper and lower school</li> <li>• Pupils encouraged to use all outdoor spaces</li> <li>• Lunch is split into two sittings in the hall as well as using some of classrooms to reduce the numbers of pupils in the dining hall</li> <li>• Reduction of movement in the hall and socials distancing marked out on the floor</li> <li>• Tables and chairs thoroughly sanitised between sittings</li> </ul>
<b>Cleaning protocols</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• After each class tables chairs and equipment is being cleaned with anti-bacterial spray and wipes.</li> <li>• Equipment such as PC's are being limited to named pupils where possible to reduce number of users. All PC's are sanitised after use with alcohol wipes.</li> <li>• High usage touchpoints such as door handles and door plates are being sanitised throughout the day.</li> <li>• Pupils and staff are encouraged to wipe the toilets seat and handle with anti-bacterial wipes after use.</li> <li>• Deep cleaning and sanitising takes place daily by contract cleaning staff</li> <li>• All classrooms and communal areas of school are kept well ventilated</li> </ul>

<b>Off site visits</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Forest School and Outdoor Pursuit visits will go ahead using school minibuses</li> <li>• All students must use face coverings on minibus and adhere to seating plans</li> <li>• College course will run from second week of term. All students attending will need to follow on-site protocols including the wearing of face coverings</li> <li>• All school minibuses will be thoroughly sanitised between separate trips</li> </ul>
<b>Transport</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transport has been arranged to reduce mixing between year groups</li> <li>• Face Coverings are worn by all Transport drivers and Escorts</li> <li>• Pupils encouraged to use Face Coverings in Taxis</li> <li>• Pupils supplied with face coverings if using public transport</li> </ul>
<b>Uniform and Equipment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pupils will be encouraged to leave unnecessary equipment at home</li> <li>• All pupils supplied with named stationary case which school will refill</li> <li>• Uniform/PE kit will need to be washed frequently in order to minimize the risk of contamination</li> </ul>
<b>Going home</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pupils escorted to collection point, seen by SLT and ask to sanitise hands before getting in taxi</li> <li>• Pupils must thoroughly wash their hands on returning home</li> </ul>
<b>Staffing</b>	<p>If a critical number of staff are absent, school will consider the need for partial or full closure, starting with tutors groups initially, potentially looking at a two week timetable (3 days/2 days)</p>
